The panelists informed about the different government schemes launched, and the benefits associated with it, nonetheless, it was also realized that there are lack of initiatives to sensitize people due to which benefits are not reaching at grass root levels. Issues relating to digital governance namely, regularity compliances, cyber security, and digital ignorance were discussed, and it was put forth that there is imperative need for digital governance framework in India.
